

The Town of Alberton is still looking for a few volunteers for a Government Review Commission. This is an opportunity to check in with how your local government runs. The scope of the review is restricted to the structure of the local government, not the policies or operations. This is a completely volunteer position with no financial compensation allowed.

The time commitment for this role can vary, but it typically involves attending regular commission meetings, participating in training sessions, and dedicating additional time for research and report preparation. On average, commissioners can expect to commit several hours per week over the course of their term. This commitment is crucial to ensure a thorough and effective review process that can lead to meaningful improvements in local governance for the community. We estimate for smaller jurisdictions that each study commissioner could expect to spend 4-6 hours on study commission duties during the first 1 – 2 months, then 3-4 hours per month after that. The minimum requirements of conducting the review steps and publishing the final report, if no changes are recommended, could be completed in 6 months or so.
